

Sermon Outline: God Never Fails a Test Malachi 3:10 by Gerald Cowan

All Scriptures and comments are based on the **New King James Version**, unless otherwise noted.

INTRODUCTION:

- 1. We are not to tempt God or put Him on trial.
- 2. But when we test Him by His word we will find he is always faithful and true **He never fails the test**.

DISCUSSION:

I. God invites and encourages His people to test and prove him, and He declares He will always be found faithful.

A. Malachi 3:10 -

God is not a man, that He should lie, Nor a son of man, that He should repent. Has He said, and will He not do? Or has He spoken, and will He not make it good? (Numbers 23:19)

- **B.**Romans 12:2
- C.1 Corinthians 10:13 cf 1 Corinthians 1:9; 2 Thessalonians 3:3
- II. Some are apparently afraid to "prove" God.
 - A. They may be afraid He will fail the test and be "too small."
 - B.They may fear they might be refused and rejected by the Lord, though He says they will not be. John 6:37; Romans 9:33.
- III. Some do not test Him because they are afraid they will find that He is what He claims to be.
 - A.If His words are true, they will be forced to believe something they would rather not believe, something that makes them afraid of Him.
 - B. "And my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:19).

- IV.One woman's example of faith in "touching Jesus." Mark 5:25-34, Luke 8:43-48.
 - **A.**She is **typical of human pain and suffering**, and of incurable disease.
 - **B.**She is **typical of human despair**, no hope of cure by ordinary means.
 - **C.** She is **typical of the hope that comes when one hears about Jesus** and reaches out to him.
 - **D.**She is **typical of the wonder that comes when Jesus reaches back** to one who is seeking him.
 - E.Do you suppose Jesus publicized the woman's action and his response in order to encourage others to reach out to him too?
- V. Does the Lord God ever fail? Can He fail? Sometimes it seems so because many prayer requests are not granted by God.
 - A.In general, you will not receive if you do not ask or if you ask without faith or with wrong motives. James 1:6; 4:3
 - B.Any request that is contrary to God's stipulated will cannot be granted by God. 1 John 5:14-15.

CONCLUSION:

- 1. Failure to receive from God may be because we have neglected or refused to meet God's conditions, or
- 2. Have failed to establish a proper relationship with Him through Jesus Christ (Acts 10:34-35, Matthew 6:33, Romans 6:17).
- 3. If God's will is accepted He must and will do what He promises.
