It was a prayer when David said:

O my God, I trust in You; Let me not be ashamed (Psalm 25:2).

All 21 times "O my God" occurs in the Bible, people were addressing God. God said through Moses,

And you shall not swear by My name falsely, nor shall you profane the name of your God: I am the LORD (Leviticus 19:12).

[New Testament Law] is not made for a righteous person, but for the lawless and insubordinate, for the ungodly and for sinners, for the unholy and profane [... and] contrary to sound doctrine (1 Timothy 1:9-10).

"Profane" means like a "doorway or threshold we cross without thinking of it." Thus, using "O my God" without directly addressing God is "profanity," and walks over God's Name without regarding its sacredness. "OMG" cannot be excused either because it is shorter!

1-22-2016 Lucifer Is Not the Devil

How you are fallen from heaven, O Lucifer, son of the morning! How you are cut down to the ground, You who weakened the nations! (Isaiah 14:12).

This is the only reference to "Lucifer" in the entire Bible, and there is nothing in **Isaiah 14** to indicate that this refers to Satan or, the Devil. Instead, this is a direct reference to Nebuchadnezzar, for God told Isaiah to:

... Take up this proverb against the king of Babylon (Isaiah 14:4).

Isaiah 14:12 says nothing about the Devil as a fallen angel, with a goatee, or with evil powers! Everyone who identifies "Lucifer" with the Devil shows ignorant misunderstanding of the Bible. Worldly-minded people have latched onto this mythical misunderstanding in books, TV series, and artwork.

[Christians must] shun profane and idle babblings, for they will increase to more ungodliness (2 Timothy 2:16).
